I.

The name of the corporation shall be HOMOSEXUAL INFORMATION CENTER, a nonprofit corporation organized under and pursuant to the General Nonprofit Corporation Law of the State of California.

II.

That the specific and primary purpose for which this corporation is formed is:

To conduct a continuing examination into the nature, circumstances and social issues of homosexuality, and to generate, gather, organize, make available and broadcast the best current thought on sexual questions generally.

III.

That the general purposes for which this corporation is formed, in addition to those enumerated above, are as follows:

1. To sue and be sued.
2. To borrow money, contract debts, issue bonds, notes and debentures, and to secure same.
3. To lease, purchase, hold, have, inherit, use and take possession of and enjoy any personal or real property necessary for the uses and purposes of the corporation, and to sell, lease, deed in trust, alienate or dispose of the same at the pleasure of the corporation, and for the uses and purposes for which said corporation in formed and buy and sell real or personal property and to apply the proceeds of sale, including any and all income, to the uses and purposes of the corporation.
4. To do any and all other acts, things business or businesses in any manner connected with or necessary, incidental, convenient or auxiliary to any of the objects hereinabove

enumerated or calculated, directly or indirectly, to promote the interest of the corporation.

5. To do any other acts or engage in any other activities not inconsistent with the general nonprofit corporation laws of the State of California.

6. Notwithstanding any of the above statements of purposes and powers, this corporation shall not, except to an insubstantial degree, engage in any activities or exercise any powers that are not in furtherance of the primary educational and literary purposes of this corporation.

IV.

This corporation is not organized, nor shall it be operated, for pecuniary gain or profit, and it does not contemplate the distribution of gains, profits, or dividends to the Members thereof and is organized solely for nonprofit purposes. The property, assets, profits and net income of this corporation are irrevocably dedicated to education and literary purposes and no part of the profits or net income of this corporation shall ever inure to the benefit of any private shareholder or individual. Upon the dissolution or winding up of this corporation, its assets remaining after payment of, or provision for payment of, all debts and liabilities of this corporation, shall be distributed to a nonprofit fund, foundation or corporation, which is organized and operated exclusively for educational and literary purposes and which has established its tax exempt status under Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code and Section 2370ld of the Revenue and Taxation Code. If this corporation holds any assets in trust, such assets shall be disposed of in such a manner as may be directed by decree of the Superior Court of the County in which this corporation's

principal office is located, upon petition therefor by the Attorney General or by any person concerned in the liquidation.

V.

The county of the State of California where the principle office for the transaction of the business of this corporation is to be located is Los Angeles County.

VI.

That the names and addresses of the persons who are to act in the capacity of Directors until the selection of their successors are:

The number of persons named above shall constitute the number of directors of trustees of the corporation, until changed by amendment to the Articles of Incorporation and/or Bylaws increasing or decreasing the number of directors of trustees as may be desired.

VII.

That the authorized number and qualifications of members of the corporation; the different classes of membership, if any, the property, voting and other rights and privileges of each class of membership, and the liability of each or all classes to dues or assessments; and the method of collection thereof shall be as set forth in the Bylaws of this corporation.

VIII.

That the Bylaws of this corporation shall be adopted by the Board of Directors and may hereafter be amended or repealed as therein provided, however any changes in the by-laws shall be in accordance with the provisions of Corporation Code Section 9400.

That this corporation is being formed as a new organization and that no existing unincorporated association will exist in a subsidiary manner.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, for the purpose of forming this corporation under the General Non-Profit Corporation Law of the State of California, the undersigned have executed these Articles of Incorporation this 14 day of August, 1968.
